Have you noticed the changes in the barn? If not, you need to stop by and take a look. The barn now serves as a site for Clearwater Wildlife Sanctuary, a state and federally licensed wildlife education and rehab center, which has a 20 year history serving south Louisiana.

The barn is staffed by several trained naturalists who have graciously submitted to screening practices we require of those working with our children. Those individuals include Margaret deLaureal, Kery Yeates, Christine Babylon, Luan Copeland, Kathy Christain, and Nancy Torcson. Their protocols include several hygienic practices such as hand washing and handling/feeding procedures for the children. All animals have been thoroughly examined by Clearwater veterinarians as well.

While I have no compunction at all regarding the children enjoying this unique facet of our quirky campus, both Clearwater and I would like to secure your permission before allowing your child to participate in the animal care program. While there are not guarantees that scratches or scrapes will not occur, our experience with Clearwater at our summer camp clearly illustrated the benefit of having full time humane education and wildlife conservation program on campus exponentially outweighs any such concerns.
