

CHRIST EPISCOPAL SCHOOL STUDENT BEHAVIOR PLEDGE

Students are responsible for following rules and regulations established by the school and the classroom teachers, as well as for conduct that is not disruptive or disrespectful and which does not violate the rights of others. Each student should become familiar with and observe the policies, rules and regulations that concern student conduct. Behavior that is unacceptable is any action that interferes with normal classroom routine or that is harmful to the child or others. The student is responsible for behaving in a manner that permits uninterrupted learning to occur.

Student Behavior Expectations

- Students at Christ Episcopal will use their time at school to learn, allowing others to do the same. This atmosphere of learning applies to the entire school day, including recess, lunch, carpool, field trips, and extended day.
- Students will treat each other and themselves with kindness and respect. Student behavior should affirm and build up others. Uncaring criticism, unkind words and vulgar language or gestures will not be tolerated. Students will not willfully hurt others physically.
- Every student will be punctual, arriving at class with appropriate books, materials, equipment, and completed assignments.
- Honesty in academics and dealings with others is expected. Students will not engage in any behavior that involves lying, cheating, stealing or plagiarizing.
- Being mindful of the rights of others, students will walk in an orderly and quiet manner, inside and outside the school buildings.
- Students are expected to dress in accordance with the dress code and with pride. The goal of the dress code is neatness and modesty.
- Students will leave at home distracting items that interfere with classroom routines and are not conducive to the learning environment. Examples include beepers, laser pointers, cell phones, radios, Game Boys, cassette and CD players, skates, skateboards and toys.
- Students are expected to value personal belongings, respect the possessions of others and show concern for the proper use of school property. The environment will be treated with care and respect. Students are expected to clean up after themselves, replace equipment, and not litter.
- Out of concern for the proper maintenance of school property, students will not chew gum while on the premises. Students and parents will clean or make restitution for any damaged property.
- No alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs will be allowed on the school campus. Consequences range from suspension to expulsion.
- No objects that may be construed as weapons will be brought to school. The use of written or oral threats or intimidating actions will not be tolerated. The consequence may be immediate expulsion.
- Teachers will be aware of the behavior of all students, not just those in their classroom. Any teacher may take disciplinary action with regard to any student.

The ultimate goal for each student is self-discipline and the acceptance of responsibility for maintaining the highest standards of behavior. Please review the behavior contract together and sign below.
