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## 2018–2019 Profile

Christ Episcopal School is an independent, church-affiliated, coeducational day school offering a challenging college-preparatory curriculum. Christ Episcopal School is accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Southwest (ISAS) and by the Southwest Association of Episcopal Schools (SAES). It is also approved by the State of Louisiana.

Located north of Lake Ponchartrain in Covington, a suburban community of New Orleans, the School occupies two campuses. Grades I–12 share an evolving campus of 45 acres that is adjacent to the I–12 corridor and expanding residential and commercial developments. Founded in 1984, CES enrolls students from a variety of cultural, social, and economic backgrounds. Historically serving Pre-K through 8th grade, the School now includes grades 9–12. There are 632 students enrolled across all divisions, and the faculty consists of 49 full-time and 23 part-time teachers. The high school has 120 students, and the Class of 2019, the School's seventh graduating class, has 18 members.
